Rules and Guidelines for Open Burning

- 1. Persons wishing to burn paper, leaves, cut grass or weeds may do so without a permit if the burning is to be done in a fire proof container constructed of metal or masonry and is equipped with a spark arrestor or lid with openings no larger than 3/4ths of an inch in diameter.
- 2. Persons wishing to burn any items other than those listed above must obtain a permit. Such items may include brush or clean wood. Persons wishing to burn anything else must obtain permission from the Fire Chief.
- 3. When you receive a request for a burn permit whether by phone or in person, the following rules are to be read to the person requesting the permit.
 - a. Burning is restricted to paper, leaves, cut grass, weeds, brush and clean lumber.
 - b. Burning must not be done within 50 feet of a structure nor shall it be allowed to spread to within 50 feet of a structure.
 - c. Fires in approved containers shall not be within 15 feet of a structure.
 - d. Hours of burning shall be from sunrise to no later than 9:00 PM.
 - e. Burning shall be constantly attended-until the fire is extinguished.
 - f. Fire extinguishing equipment must be on site and ready for immediate use. Such equipment includes: dirt sand, garden hose, water barrel, water-truck or fire extinguisher with rating of 4A.
 - g. Burn piles shall be kept small, preferably no larger than 5 feet by 5 feet by 5 feet.
 - h. Permits-may be refused or cancelled by the Fire Dept. when atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make-the fire hazardous.
 - i. Burning that becomes offensive or objectionable due to smoke or odor emissions will be extinguished by the permit holder or the Fire Department.
- 4. The Fire Department personnel taking the request for the burn permit shall enter the appropriate information in the Burn Permit Log.
